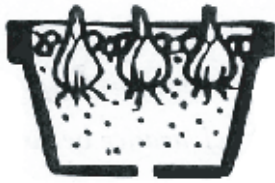




# GROWING PAPERWHITES



## POTTING



Select your container. You may use one with or without a drainage hole. Fill with potting soil and bury bulbs (pointed end up) so that only the top third of the bulb is showing. Bulbs may be spaced as close as 1/2". For a traditional look, cover the surface with gravel or moss. Water well.

## LIGHT

Shoots will start growing in a few days. Keep your paperwhites in as much bright, direct sun as possible to help ensure the foliage stays stocky and strong. Move to indirect light when flowering to prolong bloom.

## WATERING

Keep the soil somewhat moist but never soggy. Allow the surface of the soil to become dry in between watering. If you are growing your paperwhite bulb in gravel and water, keep the water level just below the base of the bulb. This will prevent the bulb from rotting.

## SPECIAL NOTES

Paperwhite bulbs are difficult to rebloom. They should be enjoyed for the blooming season. Discard after bloom.
